

The Process

Assessment

A confidential assessment is the first step in determining if further services are needed. The assessment begins with a short screening conducted over the phone by our staff to determine if our services can meet your specific needs. If not, you will be referred to a provider within the community that specializes in your particular situation. We will set up a time for you to meet with a counselor at Common Ground who will ask you a series of questions to determine where you fall in the spectrum of substance use. In most cases, a recommendation will be made to you immediately after the assessment interview is concluded.

Programs

Common Ground provides confidential substance abuse rehabilitation services specifically designed to assist individuals in addressing issues and achieving goals that they have set with their counselor. We maintain the strengths of traditional treatment models, while also incorporating new techniques and approaches. Common Ground provides individuals with the support, knowledge and tools needed to enjoy a lifestyle free of alcohol and chemical abuse. Most programs are gender specific and meet one to three times a week.

Continued Care

Common Ground helps clients focus on the changes needed to prevent future abuse of alcohol or other drugs. We work with clients to create a recovery plan, then help put the plan into action by linking clients with the appropriate community resources.

Confidentiality

Common Ground honors and respects the confidentiality of our clients. Federal regulations (CFR 42 and HIPAA) prohibit Common Ground from releasing any information without the specific written consent of the client. Clients are asked to sign releases that specify the type of information to be released, to whom the information is released, and a time frame for releasing the information.

Payment Options

Common Ground offers a full-range of payment options. We have in-network agreements with most insurance and managed care companies. With your permission, we will work with your insurance or managed care company to determine your benefits. In addition, we accept county and federal government sponsored payment programs. Payment arrangements are available for those obligated for co-payments or deductibles, and those who have no other means of payment.
